We are looking for a number of personal care support assistants to work with a number of service users with a diverse range of personal care and support needs. All of our service users have a learning disability and some have additional health care needs, including visual impairment, mental health and dementia.

We currently are looking for people who can work with, who have experience and enthusiasm to support people like this:

- 1. A person with visual impairment, who needs an additional person in his team to ensure that the extra support hours he is requiring now can be met - more evenings, weekends and sleep-ins. You need to be a good motivator, kind and caring - able to offer reassurance but develop his confidence further- and own your own car so you can drive him to and from activities, including singing, which he really enjoys.**
- 2. A person who likes a structured routine, loves to be active, goes to the gym, does sporty activities like tennis, and needs proactive support to keep up with household chores and cooking healthy meals. He needs someone who has a car so he can get to and from these activities**
- 3. A person who enjoys cooking and baking for fun and likes to go on trips out in the car and on public transport. She gets on well with a person who isn't too assertive instead is quietly confident, patient, caring and able to stay calm but also needs to be fun and have a good sense of humour.**

Your training will result in you being confident and competent in all aspects of personal care, manual handling, managing medication policies and procedures. You need to be a confident driver, have a genuinely caring personality and enjoy working with adults with learning disabilities. You'll get to learn alongside some of the best support care teams in the county.

You are available to support a variety of day and evening shifts in the week Monday to Friday, at least 2 weekends each month and Bank holidays to provide care and support to improve the lives of those you have the privilege to work with.
